Things We Didn't See Coming and Never Let Me Go

Practice Topics

- 1. 'While the world of *Never Let Me Go* is more superficially idyllic than the one in *Things We Didn't See Coming*, the characters are in a more painful situation.' Discuss.
- 2. "You're trained ... and you stay professional. Anyway, all our lives are big dark disasters." (*Things We Didn't See Coming*) "... so long as a corporation or a politician could see a benefit in supporting us, then we were able to keep afloat." (*Never Let Me Go*). Compare the ways in which these texts show the harmful effects of excessive control.
- 3. Compare how Things We Didn't See Coming and Never Let Me Go view the power of love.
- 4. Compare the ways in which the two texts condemn social inequality.
- 5. 'People often recognise the misuse of power, but they are rarely able to change it.' Compare how this idea is explored in the two texts.
- 6. "... I am sure in my blood we'll doom ourselves to always live exactly as we have lived ...never staying anywhere long enough to make anything real." (*Things We Didn't See Coming*) "... some people ... start out positively enough, but then comes all that time spent so close to the pain and the worry. And sooner or later a donor doesn't make it ... you're demoralised." (*Never Let Me Go*). Compare the role of hope in *Things We Didn't See Coming* and *Never Let Me Go*.
- 7. Compare the ways in which *Things We Didn't See Coming* and *Never Let Me Go* represent societies characterised by fear.
- 8. Compare the choices made by the protagonists in *Things We Didn't See Coming* and *Never Let Me Go.*
- 9. Compare what *Things We Didn't See Coming* and *Never Let Me Go* have to say about the ways in which individuals respond to moral dilemmas.
- 10. Compare how these two texts examine the impact of misinformation and repression.
- 11. Compare how the two texts show the importance of human freedom in difficult circumstances.
- 12. "If asked, I will tell her that it was never a conscious wish of mine to become a criminal. It was an apocalyptic choice." (*Things We Didn't See Coming*) "Your life must now run the course that's been set for it." (*Never Let Me Go*). Compare how the two texts explore the importance of personal freedom.
- 13. Compare how the two texts examine the themes of betrayal and deception.
- 14. Compare what the two texts suggest about the importance of relationships.
- 15. 'Fear and anxiety can drive people to act in uncharacteristic ways.' Compare the ways in which the two texts explore responses to fear.
- 16. 'Power and corruption go hand-in-hand.' Compare how this idea is explored in the two texts.
- 17. Compare how the texts depict what it means to be human.
- 18. Compare the ways in which the two texts explore the inequities in their societies.
- 19. Compare how *Never Let Me Go* and *Things We Didn't See Coming* explore the importance of adaptability in an uncertain future.
- 20. How does the inevitability of loss shape the experiences of the characters in the two texts?
